


Acknowledgement of Country

Wianamatta, or 'Mother's Place' is a complex water system that travels from Dharawal Country in the south, through Dharug Country in the Aerotropolis. It is made of an interconnected network of ephemeral creeks and resource rich, swampy Country, also known as wetlands. Through impacts of colonisation and agricultural land use, these water systems have been fragmented and damaged. As the future of Aerotropolis changes, it is vital we commit to healing and revitalising water on Country.







What did we hear? (what you liked)

- General support for Sydney Water as the Regional Stormwater Authority and agreement on management arrangements
- Welcome the opportunity to put forward alternate solutions and innovations for consideration
- Maintaining a robust consultation regarding Drainage Scheme was the most important principle
- Increased collaboration with landowners and developers is a key opportunity
 - Principles that drive for efficiency in cost and performance
 - Desire to expediate in-kind arrangements for development applications already in flight

What did we hear? (areas for improvement)



Request for further flexibility in the approach, particularly in Mamre Road Precinct

Concern about timing of infrastructure considering pace of development



Perceived reduction in developable land from the size and location of wetlands and ponds







Need for more direct consultation with individual landowners (particularly land acquisition)

Some expressed desire for piping of creeklines to increase developable land

The Draft Drainage Scheme Plan needs to be clearer and have more detail

Need for more information and clarity in the framework and Scheme Plan

What did we hear about Country?



General support for Sydney Water's naturalised approach to drainage in the Aerotropolis. A natural approach to waterway management is considered best for Country.



A more holistic approach to planning in the region should be considered. Cultural values and groundwater mapping will help to identify places of significance, and identify the best location for wetlands.

Embedding of First Nations voices into ongoing Management of the region is important. Opportunities for ongoing direct land management by Aboriginal people should be explored.

Scheme Planning to identify opportunities for access to waterways, for Aboriginal community members to gather, practice culture, and Care for Country.

Sydney Water's approach presents an opportunity to reintroduce and protect existing habitat for local flora and fauna, such as the Mulgoa (black swan).








What's next? Activity for the remainder of 2022
