

Proposed temporary construction compound in Memorial Park and at John Whitton Bridge



- 1 Potential trimming of trees along construction route
- 2 Temporary toilets (including disabled and baby changing facilities) to be provided during construction
- 3 Playground and picnic areas to remain open
- 4 Location of barometric loop which will be incorporated into, or co-located with, or adjacent to, the existing toilet block
- 5 Tree protection of mature trees at top of Memorial Park hill
- 6 Memorial walkway to remain open
- 7 Active transport to remain open and traffic management to be implemented
- 8 Temporary loss of parking

Greater Parramatta and Olympic Peninsula water cycle management project

We are investing in more sustainable and long-term wastewater treatment, shifting from our reliance on coastal treatment and ocean discharge.

What to expect?

- Construction corridor and compound for open trench and river release pipeline construction activities. The compound will also be used for construction activities and storage of material and equipment
- We will be in the road corridor and park for approximately 6 months including site establishment, open trench construction activities and park restoration
- Work is planned to operate during standard construction hours, **7:00am to 6:00pm Monday to Friday and Saturday 8:00am to 1:00pm**
- Trimming of trees and removal only when necessary
- The road, park, carparks and river foreshore will be restored following completion of construction
- The commuter carpark east of John Whitton Bridge is designated as a potential overflow compound for storage of additional material and equipment
- More detailed information will be included in the EIS Amendment Report to be published in late 2026

Note: Once constructed, the proposed river release pipeline will be located below ground
