North West Wastewater Connection - Investigation works

The population in Sydney's north west is expected to double by 2056. Development in the Metro North West Growth Corridor and North West Growth Area has accelerated, so we're delivering the North West Wastewater Connection project as part of a suite of projects to support growth and ensure the ongoing reliability and enhance the resilience of wastewater treatment in the region.

The North West Wastewater Connection project will connect the pumping station at Taylee Place to the Rouse Hill Water Resource Recovery Facility (WRRF) via a new 800 metre long underground pipeline.

We will also complete some upgrades at the pumping station to increase capacity and install an emergency generator for back-up power supply.

This work will be delivered by Ironbark Joint Venture and is part of a transformative investment to ensure our water, wastewater and stormwater systems meet the needs of our customers now and in the future.

What you need to know

To help us plan these upgrades, we need to carry out investigation work from Tuesday 7 January 2025, weather permitting, and expect the work to take three weeks to finish. Our working hours are **Monday to Friday from 7am to 6pm, and Saturdays from 8am to 1pm.**

Work will take place within the Rouse Hill WRRF at Mile End Road, the pumping station at Taylee Place and two local roads along the alignment. These roads are Hare Place and Yorlin Place. For works on local roads, we will send a letter with further details to nearby properties prior to works. Additional investigation work is also taking place at Lot 96 Hare Place, Rouse Hill.

Activities include site surveying, service locating, drilling boreholes, soil sampling, and groundwater assessments.

To plan works, geo spatial mapping will be carried out by drone. This will allow for the collection of accurate geo spatial information to refine the tunnel and pipeline design. Please note the use of a drone over the works area including private property is not intended for the general collection of information only of geo spatial data.

You may notice noise or dust from our investigations and machinery on site, however, we will make every effort to reduce the impact this work may have on you.
