Geotechnical investigation work | Carlisle Street | April 2025

Below the cliffs of Vaucluse and Diamond Bay, wastewater flows directly into the ocean untreated. It's time for change and we're continuing to work to ensure this iconic area of Sydney gets the clean, blue backyard it deserves. Under the Refresh Vaucluse Diamond Bay project, we are building new infrastructure to divert the flows from the last three remaining ocean outfalls in Sydney to the Bondi Water Resource Recovery Facility (WRRF).

In preparation for construction of a new wastewater pipeline in Rose Bay, we will be conducting additional geotechnical investigation on Carlisle Street. This work is scheduled to start in the week commencing **21 April 2025** and is expected to take 3 days to complete, weather permitting.

What's happening

Geotechnical site investigations

The work will involve borehole drilling (creating deep holes) and excavation (removing soil/rock) in sections of the road and nature strip. Borehole drilling is used to collect soil and rock samples to assess the ground conditions. All activities will be carried out under the full-time supervision of the Project Engineers.

During this period, you will notice some construction vehicles moving material and equipment around the work area. Once the work has been completed all affected areas will be reinstated.

The footpath on the western side of Carlisle Street outside of properties 34 –38 Carlisle Street will be temporarily closed during the 4-days. Traffic control and pedestrian signage will be in place on Carlisle Street and Conway Avenue to assist pedestrians to move safely past our work sites.

Temporary removal of parking

Carlisle Street will remain open to traffic during this work. Some parking spaces will be restricted, and areas of 'no parking' will be in place. Restricted parking on Carlisle Street will remain in place and our work will be conducted outside of these times.

The areas of 'no parking' will be clearly delineated with traffic barriers and signs advising dates when no parking will apply. We will release this parking once the work is complete. To ensure the safety of our crew, residents and road users, traffic control and signage will be in place.

A map is provided overleaf showing the work area.

Equipment

Equipment and machinery to be used for the work include:

- truck mounted drill rig
- ground penetrating radars
- excavator.

To minimise impacts we will

- use dust suppression techniques
- stage our work in sections
- install noise blankets around work areas where possible, to minimise noise
- turn off machinery when not in use.

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




Our work hours
