Temporary removal of parking for investigation work on Carlisle Street and Dover Road Rose Bay in January 2025

Sydney Water and its delivery partner Abergeldie Complex Infrastructure (ACI) are constructing a new pump station at Parsley Bay. The pump station and supporting infrastructure will redirect untreated wastewater from one of the last remaining ocean outfalls and transfer it to the Bondi treatment plant via new pipelines. This project will improve the coastal water quality and help protect the health of marine ecology by removing untreated wastewater from the ocean.

In preparation for construction of a new wastewater pipeline in Rose Bay, we will be conducting additional investigation and potholing work along Carlisle Street and Dover Road (approximately 15 metres south of the pedestrian crossing on Dover Road). This work is scheduled to start in the week commencing **13 January 2025** and **will last up to three weeks, weather permitting**. To minimise traffic impacts, we are planning this work during the school holidays.

What's happening

Investigation and potholing

A new pipeline underneath Carlisle Street and a section of Dover Road will be installed in **September 2025**. To prepare for this work, investigations and potholing is required. This is in addition to the work that was undertaken in **October 2024**. Our work will involve small sections of digging, trenching and saw cutting on the road.

During this period, you will notice some noise and construction vehicles moving material and equipment around the work area. Once the work has been completed all affected areas will be reinstated. A map is provided overleaf which shows the work area.

Temporary removal of parking

Carlisle Street and Dover Road will remain open to traffic during this work. Some parking will be restricted, and areas of 'no parking' will be in place. To minimise parking impacts, we will be staging our work in sections as we work along Carlisle Street and Dover Road. The areas of 'no parking' will be clearly delineated with traffic barriers and signs advising of dates when no parking will apply. To ensure the safety of our crew, residents and road users, traffic control and signage will be in place.

Equipment

Equipment and machinery to be used for the work include:

- excavator
- road saw
- vacuum truck
- wet/dry vacuum.

To minimise impacts we will

- use dust suppression techniques
- stage our work in sections
- install noise blankets around work areas where possible, to minimise noise
- turn off machinery when not in use.

Our work hours

Monday to Friday, from 7 am to 6 pm and on Saturdays from 8 am to 1 pm. If we need to work outside these hours, we will notify residents in advance.
